

### **Debbie Rademacher - Lead Clinician**

One of the most decorated women's players in the country, Coach Rademacher brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to Saline.

Debbie was a three-time all-American at UMass and played in four Final Fours. She was named to the Soccer America Team of the Century.

Debbie was a member of the US National Women's Team from 1986-1991 and a teammate with Julie Foudy and Mia Hamm. Debbie's team captured the 1991 Women's World Cup title.

Debbie earned her USSF A License and began coaching soon after playing for the National team. Debbie started women's programs at Fairfield University and the University of Michigan. Debbie coached at the University of Michigan from 1994-2007. Her teams earned 9 NCAA berths and had many successful tournament runs including a 2002 Elite 8 and 2003 Sweet 16 run.

Debbie also started the University of Michigan Girl's soccer camp where she worked with hundreds of youth and high school girls from 1994-2007.

Debbie resides in Ann Arbor with her husband and two children.

### **Cam Cameron - Staff Clinician**

Cam is a 2004 graduate of Saline High School. A three year letter winner and former captain, Cam helped guide the Hornets to a Division I State Finals' appearance. A prolific scorer, Cam set Saline scoring records and earned Second Team All-State Honors in 2003.

A current member of the University of Michigan Men's Team, Cam was the third leading scorer on the team as a freshman. Cam played in every game and started in three.

## Brian Lampman - Camp Director

Brian Lampman will begin his ninth year coaching the Saline boys' varsity team this fall. He previously coached six years at his alma mater, Pioneer High School; five with the girls' freshman team and one with the boys' junior varsity. Coach Lampman holds a National D License and directs frequent youth clinics in Saline. He has attended coaching clinics at the University of Michigan and Indiana University, and has previously worked as a staff coach for the University of Michigan Girl's Soccer Summer Camps.

Coach Lampman's teams have earned three SEC Titles, five straight district finals' appearances, two regional titles and one Division I State Finals' runner-up title. The Varsity team has been ranked in the state division I top ten in four of the five past years; completing the 2003 campaign at #2 in the state coaches' poll, #9 in 2004 and #7 in 2007. The team earned the 2004 MHSAA Sportsmanship award and 2005 SEMRA Sportsmanship award. Lampman was the 2003, 2004 and 2007 District Coach of the Year, and the 2004 Ann Arbor News Coach of the Year.

Coach Lampman graduated from Pioneer High School where he earned varsity letters in soccer, basketball, cross country and track. Lampman completed his undergraduate degrees and teaching certificate from the University of Michigan, where he briefly competed as a walk-on for the University of Michigan cross country and indoor track teams. He earned his Masters degree from Eastern Michigan University. This fall, Lampman will begin his twelfth year of teaching in the Saline School District and first year at the High School.

Lampman is passionate about studying the complex role that sports plays in our society. Lampman integrates sports sociology lessons into his curriculum to teach his students about race, gender, social class and the history of our country. Lampman has presented nationally in the sports sociology field at the North American Society for the Sociology of Sport in Cleveland and Indianapolis, and the National Consortium for Academics and Sport in Orlando. Lampman was also director of the 2005 Saline Sports in Society Lecture Series, a year-long series culminating with an appearance by Olympic Gold Medalist Julie Foudy. Lampman's first co-edited book in the Sports Sociology field, Learning Culture Through Sport, was published in March 2006 by Rowman Education and his second book is due out in fall of 2008.

Lampman resides in Ann Arbor with his wife, Justina, and sons, Kale and Tate. Lampman would one day like to live in Disney, play golf and throw water balloons at his kids.
